PROPOSAL ASSESSMENT

Proposal Assessment is the process of accessing each proposal to establish a more comprehensive understanding of the author's intent. The assessment should focus on evaluating the stated goals of the proposal as well as identifying the need for additional qualitative written feedback if necessary. The person assessing the proposal must represent the views of the constituent group, not personal opinion. You may do this by sharing the proposals with your constituents and soliciting feedback. In doing so, you should distribute the rubric below and the introductory statements above to be used for assessment. When scoring, use the feedback you receive to guide scoring.



Proposal Assessment will provide scores on:

Outcomes: Does the proposal address a need that has been identified through outcomes assessment? Is that need clearly articulated and based on robust evidence?

Urgency: Does the proposal need to be implemented immediately or could it be delayed?

Student Impact: Does the proposal directly or indirectly affect the success of students?

Financial Risk: Does the proposal represent a financial risk for the College?

Budget Accuracy: Does the proposed budget seem reasonable and accurate?

PROPOSAL ASSESSMENT TOOL

The below-mentioned Proposal Assessment tool is a part of a larger methodology developed for the European Union to assess the quality of proposals.

1. Read the proposal and underline all mentioned problems (in the Needs Analysis), objectives, and activities and mark them with P, O, or A.
2. Make three columns: Problems, Objectives, and activities. Write all problems, objectives, and activities mentioned in the proposal in the column where they belong, having the above mentioned characteristics of problems, objectives, and activities in mind.
3. Answer the following questions to assess the quality of the logic of the proposal:
 - Are the links clear between mentioned problems, objectives, and activities (do the objectives follow logically from the problem's objective= no problem)?
 - Does every activity into an objective? (more than one activity can lead to/fit to one objective)
 - Does every objective solve a mentioned problem (not all problems mentioned and described have to be solved but is described why the choice is made to solve one set of problems instead of another set of problems?)
 - Which questions (mostly about the problems) have to be answered to be able to write a better structure?





Orientation Program on Enabling Organizations on Fundraising

One of the working groups created at the ICA General Assembly on July 17, 2021 is the Global Fundraising Taskforce. Three Key Fundraising Segments/Streams are identified and they are: ICA Community, Grant Making Bodies, and In Country Fundraising. In-country fundraising is one of the three key fundraising segments or streams that have been identified which is coordinated by ICA Nepal team. Altogether 11 organizations have expressed the interest to participate in this initiation. The overall objective of this initiative is to strengthen the internal and external capacities of ICAs/organizations in developing countries in raising funds. Specific objectives are as follows:

- Develop a common web based portal for ICAs in sharing resources
- Enable ICAs in identifying the internal sources of funds : membership and training
- Develop a core fundraising team

ICA Nepal is working through the NGO Support Program supporting different organizations working in the field of educational development, helping differently abled people, orphanages, children, women and old age people. The ICA Network was established with the aim of reaching the wider community and addressing a myriad of needs and problems. The ICA Network is seen as an introduction towards an improved society with better living conditions for all. It is a desire, an attempt to step up a campaign with a movement to create an opportunity for human development in a real setting. It helps, enables, facilitates and empowers the organizations for development of the community as a whole.

On behalf of the In-country Fundraising Stream, ICA Global Fundraising Taskforce, ICA Nepal conducted the orientation program on Enabling Organization on Fundraising. Participants came from Kenya, Togo, Uganda, Ghana, Bangladesh, and other countries, as well as ICAs and organizations from all over the world. The fundamental objective of this program was to improve the capacity of ICAs and other organizations in developing countries to raise funds both domestically and abroad. ICA Nepal shared awareness on how this mechanism works as Nepal has been working in the program “Fundraising for NGOs in Nepal”. Further plan was also decided on this vary meeting. Project proposal writing and fundraising training was scheduled for September 1 - 3, 2022.



Promoting STEAM Education in the Schools of Nepal

ICA Nepal has been promoting integrated approach to science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics in order to improve hands-on learning with real-world applications helping in developing a variety of skill sets, including creativity and 21st-century skills. ICA Nepal has been coordinating to different Rotaract Clubs members and different organizations. Last July, a seminar was conducted where each participant represented one or more academic institutions. So,, distribution of materials and allotted budgets were made in order to carry out the STEAM Education project. Many have already started to work on it.



Celebration of Teej Festival

Teej or Haritalika Teej, one of the main festivals for all the Hindu women, usually falls on the full moon day in the month of September and welcomes the monsoon season. Girls and women celebrate with songs, dancing and prayer rituals. Nepali women have long used it as a forum to express their suppressed emotions, raise their voices for identity subversion, as well as to indulge in and recreate themselves. Teej customs has much more to tell about awareness, advocacy and empowerment related to women. The Teej festival was also celebrated by ICA Nepal.
